Three Sisters Group Site – Accepting 2019 Reservations

Hamilton, Montana (February 7, 2019) – The Darby Ranger District will be accepting applications for the Three Sisters Group Site Campground at Lake Como beginning this Monday, February 11th at 8am. The group site is located near the lake, across the road from the Rock Creek Horse Camp/trailhead. It opened to the public in 2011 and features a large wooden pavilion, 8 picnic tables, group size BBQ grill and fire ring with handcrafted benches, toilets, parking for 25 vehicles, and a capacity to hold 75 people. There is no water or electricity.

The site is very popular for family gatherings, re-unions, and outdoor wedding receptions. To reserve your dates for 2019, contact the Darby Ranger District at (406) 821-3913 or visit their office located at 712 N. Main Street in Darby. Reservations will be taken on a first-come, first-serve basis.

The Bitterroot National Forest normally accepts reservations for this site beginning January 15th, but the date was moved back this year due to the government shutdown.
