## Spinners Challenge Fiber for 2022

### **DOWN BREEDS**

Spinners Challenge consists of fiber spun from a Down Breed (Suffolk, Southdown, Dorset, etc.) and displayed as a finished item (not just spun fiber). **Use of Down Breed must be at least 50%.** Fiber content used must be stated on a hanging tag on the exhibit. All entries must be shown and judged in a regular division in the Natural Fiber department.

**\*Please notify the Superintendent on entry day that item is a "Spinners Challenge".**

Selection of winner will be made with strong consideration given to creativity, quality of spinning, suitability of yarn to the final project and overall quality of the work.

### **Scorecard for Judging Spinners Challenge**

#### **Creativity:**

Originality of design & technique;

Use of color & texture .....40%

#### **Spinning Quality:**

Consistency of twist.....10%

Size of yarn appropriate to fiber used & finished product.....20%

Finished project demonstrates appropriate use of spun yarn .....20%

#### **Finishing:**

Blocking, fulling, seaming and embellishment appropriate for finished item .....10%

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. **8"x10" or 8"x12" photos only**
2. Photo must be securely taped to mat. **11"x14", Mat Frame Required – secure photo with masking tape (backer is recommended not required)**
3. Mats will be available at the fair office for purchase. (while supplies last) \$2 for 8x10 \$3 for 8x12 black mat (you must mount photos on your own)
4. Mat, 11"x14" outside dimension. **NOT** accepted: frames, wood, metal, glass, shrink wrap, etc.
5. Tag placement: upper left corner
6. Requirement for photo pick up: detachable section of claim tag
7. Clearly print your name and phone number on back of each mat frame.
8. **Maximum 6 entries per person total.**
9. **Maximum 1 entry per class per person.**
10. Class 23, Group of Photos: Photos must be 4x6 or 5x7. Mounting board/backer is required no larger than 16"x20".
11. Age classes: Adult: 18 and older; Junior: 12-17 years; Children: 5-11 years.

Here are a few simple tips:

- Use a tripod for a sharp photo
- Use the rule of thirds
- Ask, "Why am I taking this shot?" Will others like it? Ask a friend if they like it.
- Look at similar photos online that are popular

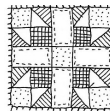

**The Open Division Goat Show will be a Show and Go on Monday. Judging will begin at 9 a.m. Check-in will begin at 7:30 a.m.**

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Refer to General & Livestock Rules.
2. No animal will be admitted to the goat barn for showing if there are visible signs of illness, such as lice, abscesses, respiratory issues, etc.
3. Entries in this department are open to both purebred and grade stock. State breed on entry form.
4. **Exhibitors may have two (2) entries per class per breed.**
5. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed and water containers.
6. Animals will be judged according to the ADGA and ABGA scorecards.
7. Dam and Daughter, Get-of-Sire, and Produce of Dam **must show in their age group first.**
8. Horned animals and wethers can be exhibited in Angora, Pygora, Pygmy and Boer only. No horns allowed in Dairy divisions.
9. Exhibitor must be present to show their own animal unless excused by the Superintendent.
10. All goats are to be removed from the fairgrounds after the conclusion of the open division show, unless the animal is being shown in 4H/FFA.
11. The Exhibitor is responsible for cleaning their area before they leave the fairgrounds.
12. Wethers or bucks cannot be shown in the dairy show.
